

SUMMARY OF RESPONBILITIES FOR DOCTORS APPOINTED IN THE OFFICIAL UWW COMPETITIONS

Please consult the UWW Medical Regulations for complete information.

As a UWW Doctor appointed in a UWW competition, your duties are:

Organization & competition

- To supervise the organization of the medical examination before the weigh-ins
- After the medical examination, to provide the UWW competition Secretariat with the list of participants, dully signed
- To supervise and follow-up the first aid to wrestlers with the help of local doctors and medical auxiliaries
- To convene a **pre-competition meeting** with the local medical team to ensure that all doctors and paramedics are familiarized with wrestling competitions, typical wrestling injuries and make sure they have the necessary qualifications.
- To verify that the equipment of the first aid room is complete and appropriate
- To decide whether an injured wrestler may resume or stop the bout, in accordance with the International Wrestling Rules
- To verify that the meals offered to the participants are appropriate and that they comply with the quantity of calories required in the UWW Medical Regulations.

Anti-doping

- To collaborate with the National Anti-Doping Organisation/or service provider for all doping tests as requested by UWW in the *Test Distribution Plan*¹, in particular:
 - to ensure that conditions are in place to allow a time efficient testing procedure;
 - to ensure that a space in the competition venue is used as a Doping Control Station (DCS) where privacy, sole use and cleanliness are guaranteed. This room will be used only as DCS and its access will be restricted.
 - If the room does not offer the Athlete privacy, and/or is intended to be used for purposes other than Doping Control while Sample collection is being carried out, you have the obligation to locate an alternative room/location to ensure that privacy and sole use are guaranteed.
 - to coordinate with the Doping Control Officers (DCFs) for the timing and selection of wrestlers (especially when random selection of wrestlers in the repechage matches is requested prior to the competition according to the test distribution plan);

¹ The Test Distribution Plan (TDP) is forwarded by UWW directly to the Sample Collection Authority (SCA). It may not be modified unless exceptional circumstances.



- to make sure that chaperones are available to accompany the selected wrestlers to the doping control room(s) and well briefed of the exact time of matches (especially for repechage matches when testing in this competition phase are requested).
- TO ENSURE THAT THE DOPING CONTROL OFFICERS SUBMIT ALL DOPING CONTROL FORMS IN <u>ADAMS</u> (directly after the test or <u>maximum 14 days after</u>).

This is a WADA requirement that is essential to ensure that all the results are included in the *Athlete Steroidal Passport* module in ADAMS.

In addition, the following information must be appropriately entered in on the doping control form and subsequently in ADAMS:

- Testing Authority: United World Wrestling
- **Sample Collection Authority:** the agency responsible for sample collection (NADO or service provider)
- Results Management Authority: United World Wrestling
- Wrestling Style: FS, GR or FW
- To ensure that all Doping Control Forms (originals) are sent to United World Wrestling's headquarters.

Injuries & reporting

- To submit all injuries in the UWW Injury Reporting System (you will be provided with a username & password before the competition)
 - Note: you will find attached the injury report paper form. You may choose to use the paper form during the competition and submit the injuries in the system afterwards or submit the injuries directly in the system during the competition.
- To fill in the "Hospital Transfer Form" attached. You are kindly requested to fill in this form in case a wrestler must be transported to hospital. This form must be handed over to the wrestler before he/she is transported to hospital. The wrestler (or the Federation) shall send it to the United World Wrestling insurance company with the accident declaration form (IMSSA).
